SEVENTH ANNUAL
TEXAS HOLD-EM
TOURNAMENT
October 15, 2011
(MUST BE AGE 21 TO PLAY)**

Welcome to the sixth annual Fall Bean Bash, Inc. Texas Hold-Em Tournament. All proceeds benefit children and adults with disabilities in Northern Kentucky. The tournament must terminate no later than 8:00 P.M., Saturday, October 15, and prizes will be determined by chip count should the tournament not end by elimination prior to that time. The following information and rules are provided to make sure everyone knows how the tournament will be conducted. The tournament director or his designated official has the final say regarding the tournament process and all rules and procedures. Good Luck and Have Fun!!!

General Information:

1. This will be **NO LIMIT** Texas Hold-Em Poker – normal poker rules followed.
2. There will be **no refunds** under any circumstances.
3. Cheating of any kind will not be tolerated.
4. Blinds will increase periodically as announced by a tournament official.
5. Tables will continuously be consolidated when players are eliminated. Please cooperate when asked to move to a different table.
6. Misdeals: The following circumstances cause a misdeal, provided attention is called to the error before two players have acted on their hands.
 - (a) The first or second card of the hand has been dealt faceup or exposed through dealer error.
 - (b) Two or more cards have been exposed by the dealer.
 - (c) Two or more boxed cards (improperly faced cards) are found.
 - (d) Two or more extra cards have been dealt in the starting hands of a game.
 - (e) An incorrect number of cards has been dealt to a player, except the top card may be dealt if it goes to the player in proper sequence.
 - (f) Any card has been dealt out of the proper sequence (except an exposed card may be replaced by the burncard).
 - (g) The button was out of position.
 - (h) The first card was dealt to the wrong position.
 - (i) Cards have been dealt to an empty seat or a player not entitled to a hand.
 - (j) A player has been dealt out who is entitled to a hand. This player must be present at the table or have posted a blind or ante.

Once action occurs, a misdeal can no longer be declared. The hand will be played to conclusion, and no money will be returned to any player whose hand is fouled. Action is considered to occur when two players after the blinds have acted on their hands.

7. Cards and chips should stay on the table.
8. Do not show your cards to another player; player must protect own hand.
9. Do not touch another player's chips.
10. No sharing or combining chips.
11. Wait for your turn to bet or fold.
12. Do not throw your chips on the pot – place your bet in front of you and after chip count observed, then push into pot.
13. Checking is allowed after the first round of betting. Check and raise is allowed. No limit on number of raises.
14. The minimum bet will always equal the big blind, although checking is allowed on the flop, turn and river. Minimum raises must equal the amount of the previous bet.
15. Each player receives 2,500 in chips (12 black, 7 orange and 3 white). The tournament will begin with a 25 small blind and a 50 large blind. The blinds will increase in roughly 30 minute increments as determined by a tournament official.

SHUFFLING AND DEALING

Players are being asked to deal at least until the final few tables. Please remember this is a charity event and there should be enough veteran players at each table to assist any novices. If you are not comfortable dealing, it is permissible to ask for a volunteer from your table to deal for you. If no one will volunteer, please ask a tournament official for help.

Regarding shuffling and dealing, there will be two decks of cards at every table. Once a hand is completed, whoever dealt the hand is responsible for shuffling the cards that were used (deck riffled a minimum of four times), and then giving the cards to the person two seats to their left. Before dealing, each dealer must offer a cut to the person sitting to their right (cut must leave a minimum of four cards in each portion). Please protect bottom card on deck from being exposed.

BLACK	25
ORANGE	100
WHITE	500
BLUE	1000
